Article Preparation Checklist

- The article has not been previously published, nor has it been under consideration by another journal (or an explanation has been provided in the comments to the editor).
- Articles will be subjected to plagiarism checks, and any ethical misconduct will be treated with the utmost seriousness.
- Authors are strongly encouraged to adhere to the Committee on Publishing Ethics (COPE) guidelines for all aspects of publication ethics: http://publicationethics.org/.
- The text adheres to the stylistic and bibliographic requirements outlined in the Author Guidelines.

Author Guidelines

General Publication Terms

- The editorial board accepts papers that have not been published previously.
- The language of AIJES is **English**.
- Articles must be situated within the context of previously published AIJES articles; therefore, all authors are kindly invited to familiarize themselves with previous AIJES issues.
- Authors are responsible for submitting proofread final articles.
- The editorial board reserves the right to carry out technical, scientific, and linguistic editing of the submitted articles.
- Before the review process, the papers will be anonymized by the AIJES journal.
- In response to the reviewers' recommendations and suggestions, authors must make corrections within the specified timeline.

The publication of articles in the AIJES journal is free of charge, and all papers are publicly available as open access.



Submission Instruction

General Requirements for Submission Formatting

- The final paper should include the following author information: name, surname, university/institution, country, *ORCID number (see the paper template).
- Papers should be prepared using Microsoft Office Word.
- Section headings should be set in bold (refer to the paper template).
- Research articles are suggested to follow the IMRaD structure.
- The full paper template can be found on the journal's webpage.
- Authors must ensure the final articles are proofread.

Requirements for Paper Formatting

- Papers must adhere to the American Psychological Association (APA, 7th ed) style.
- The recommended article length is normally between 4000 and 8000 words (excluding figures, tables, and references).
- Article titles should typically consist of a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12 words.
- Abstracts should typically comprise a minimum of 150 and a maximum of 250 words, summarizing the paper's main issues and key findings.
- Papers may be formatted with 1.2 line spacing, preferably in Times New Roman font size 12. All accepted papers will be correctly formatted for publication.
- For more details, refer to the article template.

Requirements for References

- References should follow the American Psychological Association (APA, 7th ed) style and be listed in alphabetical order.
- References for the author's own papers or articles (self-citation) should not exceed 10% of the total number of sources.
